OF

The Roll of Honour

Commemorating the names of the Men of this Parish and District who have fallen in the Service of their King and Country in this War.

DEARLY beloved in the Lord, for as much as devout men and women, as well under the Law as under the Gospel, moved either by the secret inspiration of the Blessed Spirit, or by the express command of GOD, or by their own reason and sense of order and decency, have not only erected Houses for the public worship of GOD and separated them from all profane and common uses, but also have from time to time adorned them with goodly gifts, in order to fill the minds of men with greater Reverence for His Glorious Majesty, and to affect their hearts with more devotion and humility in His Service, which pious works have been approved of and graciously accepted by our Heavenly Father; Let us not doubt but that He will also favourably approve our present purpose of dedicating in solemn manner this Roll of Honour, and let us faithfully and devoutly pray for His Blessing in this our undertaking.

We humbly commend into Thy Hands the souls of Thy Servants, our dear Brothers, whose names are here remembered, beseeching Thee to give us grace so to follow their good examples, that with them we may be partakers of Thy heavenly Kingdom; Grant this O Father, for JESUS CHRIST'S sake, our only Mediator and Advocate. *Amen.*
